Volunteer at Project Open Hand

Tuesday, July 11, 9:00am - 12:00pm . Join MAX in volunteering at Project Open Hand, a non-profit social services organization borne during the AIDS epidemic in the 1980s to prepare meals for those with AIDS suffering from malnutrition. The organization continues to serve people with HIV/AIDS and has expanded to feed seniors and people fighting cancer, heart disease, diabetes and many other serious illnesses. Docent tour of the Anderson Collection & Cantor Museum at Stanford

Sunday, July 16, 10:45am - 1:30pm (excluding optional lunch)

MAX has arranged a guided docent tour of two celebrated museums, the Anderson Collection and the Cantor Arts Center at Stanford University in Palo Alto. Museums are located one block apart and about 36 miles south of San Francisco.

Anderson Collection contains an outstanding private assembly of modern and contemporary American art. The collection is anchored in the work of Abstract Expressionists like Jackson Pollock and extends to contemporary painters

such as Terry Winters, Sean Scully and Julie Mehretu. For more information, go to: <https://anderson.stanford.edu/>



The Cantor's collection spans 5,000 years and includes more than 38,000 works of art from around the globe. It features 24 galleries and numerous special exhibitions. Current exhibits include *The Faces of Ruth Asawa; Printing Protest; Reality Makes Them Dream: American Photography 1929-1941, and; Richard Diebenkorn's paintings and sketchbooks*. The museum also features the Rodin Sculpture Garden, Richard Serra's *Sequence* and Richard Diebenkorn's paintings and sketchbooks that shed light on Diebenkorn's process. Nearby parking is free in the garage and street on weekends except for the residents students lots.
