Forum: Living Trusts / Estate Plan

Tuesday, January 10. 6:00pm - 7:30pm. It's The New Year. Did You Make A Resolution To Do An Estate Plan? Come find out why you might need an estate plan and why estate planning is particularly important for the LGBTQ community. Estate Planning attorney Edward Joy will walk us through some real-life examples to show us who needs an estate plan and why. He will discuss who is a good candidate for do-it-yourself estate planning and who is not. There will be plenty of time to answer your questions. Duration is about an hour.

Edward Joy has his own law practice specializing in estate planning, probate, and trust administration in the San Francisco Bay Area. He received a J.D. from Harvard Law School and has been selected as a Northern California Super Lawyer, an award reserved for the top 5% of all attorneys in Northern California, for the last seven years in a row. He is a former Board Member of Bay Area Lawyers for Individual Freedom, the United States' oldest and largest bar association of LGBTQ attorneys.
